The match will be held at the Premier League home of Brighton & Hove Albion in May. Bridges will face either Eastbourne Boro or Brighton & Hove Albion U21s. It is the 144th year of the SSC and it will be their first time in the final. Bridges got past Little Common and then demolished Wick 10-0 before taking on the big boys of Horsham. Having taken that giant killing step they then shocked Worthing 4-2 in the semi final at Culver Road Lancing, to earn their place in Sussex Football history.

REDS AT TANGERINES

If you happened to take in the Dundee Utd V Celtic game on Sun 22nd March, you will have stumbled across some CTFC old boys. No 8 Panutche Camara replaced No 36 Max Watters on 89 minutes in their 2.0 win over the Glasgow hoops. Driving the team along, and getting a man of the match call, was their No 11 Will Ferry. Ferry was on loan to us in 2021/22 from Southampton and made 36 appearances. Max Watters really made a name for himself whilst at the Reds in the 2020/21 season - scoring 13 goals in 15 starts. (He is currently on loan from Barnsley.) Panutche is a bit of a minor Crawley legend - having made 103 appearances from 2017 to 2020 and then another 42 in the 2024/25 season, before swapping his Red shirt for a Tangerine one.

FAB SCOTT, THUNDERBIRDS ARE GO!!!!!!!

Back In November 2025, the club announced plans to establish a new Fan Advisory Board (FAB) in conjunction with the Football Supporters Association (FSA).

At the outset of the process, the club met with the Football Supporters' Association to establish the core aims of the Fan Advisory Board.

A key priority was to ensure a diverse and representative board; including a female member and a supporter under the age of 30 and as a result, following recommendations from the FSA, Victoria Morris-Birrell and Kieran Sullivan were offered positions on the FAB until Summer 2027.

As well as Kieran and Victoria, places on the FAB were also allocated to a committee member of the Crawley Town Supporters Alliance (CTSA) and a representative of GH Coaches, to join the FAB. Two additional seats are being reserved for a Commercial Sponsor representative and a member of the Crawley Town Community Foundation.

The club, having been incredibly pleased with the high calibre of candidates that applied to be part of the new FAB, then started the election process to determine the remaining four members of the board, from the following set of successfully interviewed candidates.

The Candidates (in alphabetical order) were as follows; Charlie Bright, David Carling, James Eddolls, Sam Jordan, Steve Leake, Chris Lord, Dan Maguire, Richard Scott and Pail Taylot-Burr. The voting system adopted was based on each person who had a purchase history with the club being allowed to cast two votes.

The following people were duly elected and I thought it would be useful for you to see what they stand for, so their election statements are included:

SAM JORDAN

"Since watching my first game as a boy, when Ben Abbey scored in the Southern League, I have been fortunate enough to enjoy the ride of seeing our club grow into an established Football League side. Over the last 15 years I have held numerous roles representing supporters and engaging several different ownership groups on ways to grow our football club, this included 5 years as chairman of the Supporters Trust.

"During my time representing supporters, there have been moments where difficult conversations were required. I have never shied away from challenging conversations when I believed it was in the long-term interests of Crawley Town and its supporters. I believe a fan representative must be independent, prepared to ask the right questions, and able to hold the club to account in a constructive and respectful way, while always keeping dialogue open and focused on progress. Whilst gaining football governance experience I have held the club ownership to account on compliance and have had an insight in to ways of working in professional football. This has enabled me to use my professional experience to advise on how to improve areas of opportunity within the football club."



STEVE LEAKE

"My name is Steve Leake, and I have been a Crawley supporter since 1956 when it was known as Crawley FC. I feel I would be an effective fan representative for Crawley Town supporters, not because of my time supporting them but because even after 70 years I am still as passionate about the boys who wear the shirt which holds our badge as I was back when my dad first took me to Town Meadow.

"I have witnessed six promotions, three relegations and a great many heroic cup matches in the years I have been watching and serving the fans of Crawley Town as a member of the Supporters Club Committee, culminating in a five-year stint as Chairman up till its amalgamation with the Devils Trust, which formed the Crawley Town Supporters Alliance. I was an interim vice chair until I started to work for the Football Club, under Simon Rusk, when we had an academy back in 2011.

"When the Football club closed the Academy, I returned to the Alliance and helped introduce the Reds Rollover as a revenue raising initiative, which has provided funds for supporter-based initiatives at the club since its introduction. The Alliance currently has

a year's worth of funding from the rollover set aside for the introduction of a Broadfield Stadium based "Crawley Town FC Museum", following two very successful exhibitions at the Crawley Museum in the High Street.

"If elected as a member of the Fans Advisory Board I would like to see this become a reality, if that is what the fans want, and would also like to encourage more fans of all sexes, races and creeds to get involved in contributing to the Red Devils' Diary initiative. Town, Team, Together, we will be successful, both on and off the field. In addition I feel that in my time supporting and working for either the fans or the club I have tried to remain positive to all I have come into contact with, be they fan, player, manager or owner."



CHRIS LORD

"I am a proud Crawley Town supporter and season ticket holder who cares deeply about this club - not just about results on the pitch, but about what it means to its supporters and the local community.

"I'm standing for the Fans' Advisory Board because, after years of frustration and a breakdown in trust, I believe this is a point where proper engagement between fans and the club really matters.

"The relationship between supporters and previous ownership has been difficult, and that has left a lot of understandable scepticism. I share many of those feelings as a fan myself. However, with new owners, recent investment in the stadium and the playing squad, and a renewed sense of optimism, I think there is a genuine chance to reset how supporters are listened to and respected. That opportunity shouldn't be wasted, and it needs fan representatives who are independent and honest.

"I don't see this role as speaking over other fans or pretending to have all the answers. Crawley supporters are passionate, vocal, and don't always agree - that's a good thing. My role would be to listen, identify the main concerns that keep coming up, and represent those views fairly and constructively.

"I'm not looking to be a mouthpiece for the club, but I also don't believe constant confrontation helps anyone. For me, it's about asking the right questions, challenging decisions when needed, and keeping conversations going rather than shutting them down.

"I'm under no illusion that trust will be rebuilt overnight. It takes time, consistency, and honesty - especially about what can and can't be changed. I'm comfortable dealing with scepticism and criticism, and I believe supporters deserve straight answers, even when they're not the ones we want to hear.

"Ultimately, I want Crawley Town to become a stronger and more sustainable club, with supporters treated as a valued part of its future. If elected, I would take this responsibility seriously and represent Crawley Town fans with integrity, independence, and genuine care for the club we all support.

DAN MAGUIRE

"My journey with Crawley Town began in 2017 as a way to fill the void left by my retirement from sport. What started as a few cold Tuesday nights quickly evolved into a deep-rooted passion, epitomised by a 500-mile round trip to Blackpool to join just 33 other fans for a dismal 0-0 draw. Despite the scoreline, I was captivated by the unwavering loyalty of our supporters.

"Seeing that dedication culminate in our emotional day at Wembley solidified my commitment to this club; it highlighted that for our fanbase, passion is about earning and consuming those rare, special moments.

"Having followed the Reds for over 300 matches and completed 'The 92,' I possess an extensive understanding of the footballing landscape.

"My time groundhopping through the Isthmian Leagues has provided a unique vantage point on how various clubs manage social media and the matchday experience on diverse budgets. This 'fan-first' perspective is balanced by my professional background as a Program Manager in the tech industry.

"Specialising in Service Management, I am a customer-centric professional who

understands the complex operational levers required to drive an organisation. My expertise lies in identifying friction points and building pragmatic, non-judgemental solutions by considering impact from every angle.

"If appointed, I will focus on five core pillars to elevate Crawley Town:

- Legacy: Honouring our history while building a sustainable future.
- One Team: Driving transparency and removing friction between the club and its fans.
- Stability: Prioritising financial health and stadium security to protect the badge.
- Social Media: Enhancing our digital profile to engage a modern audience.
- Matchday Experience: Optimising the "gate-to-gate" experience for home and away supporters.

"As an Arsenal fan from birth, my DNA has always been "pure red," but my heart now belongs to Crawley. I am eager to apply my professional problem-solving skills to ensure

our loyal fanbase receives the service and experience they deserve."

As you can see we have a good cross section of established and passionate fans representing us. In closing, I must perhaps admit to also having an affinity to Stoke City (my dad was from Alton, near Stoke on Trent) and also Manchester United, because of the Munich 1958 tragedy, but like Dan my heart is a Crawley heart and will be as long as it keeps on beating.

Incidentally, following my article in the Barnet Programme about missing games in action, those that know me will have been surprised to find me back behind the sales kiosk.... without my arm in a sling/sporting a bionic shoulder.

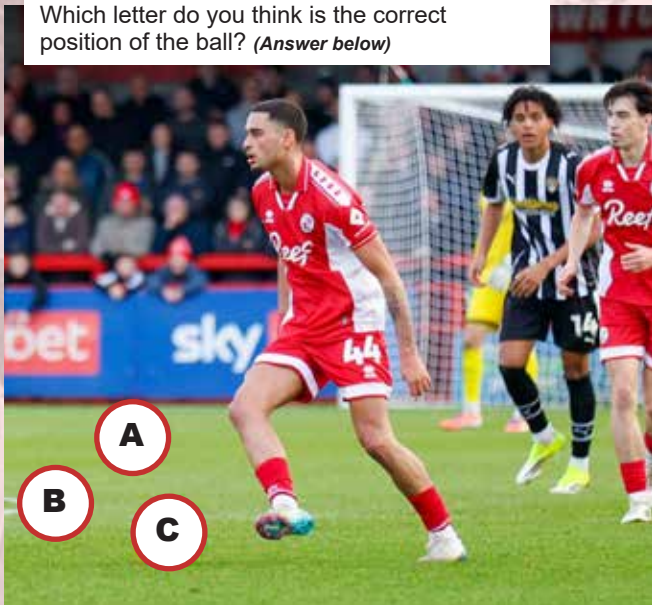

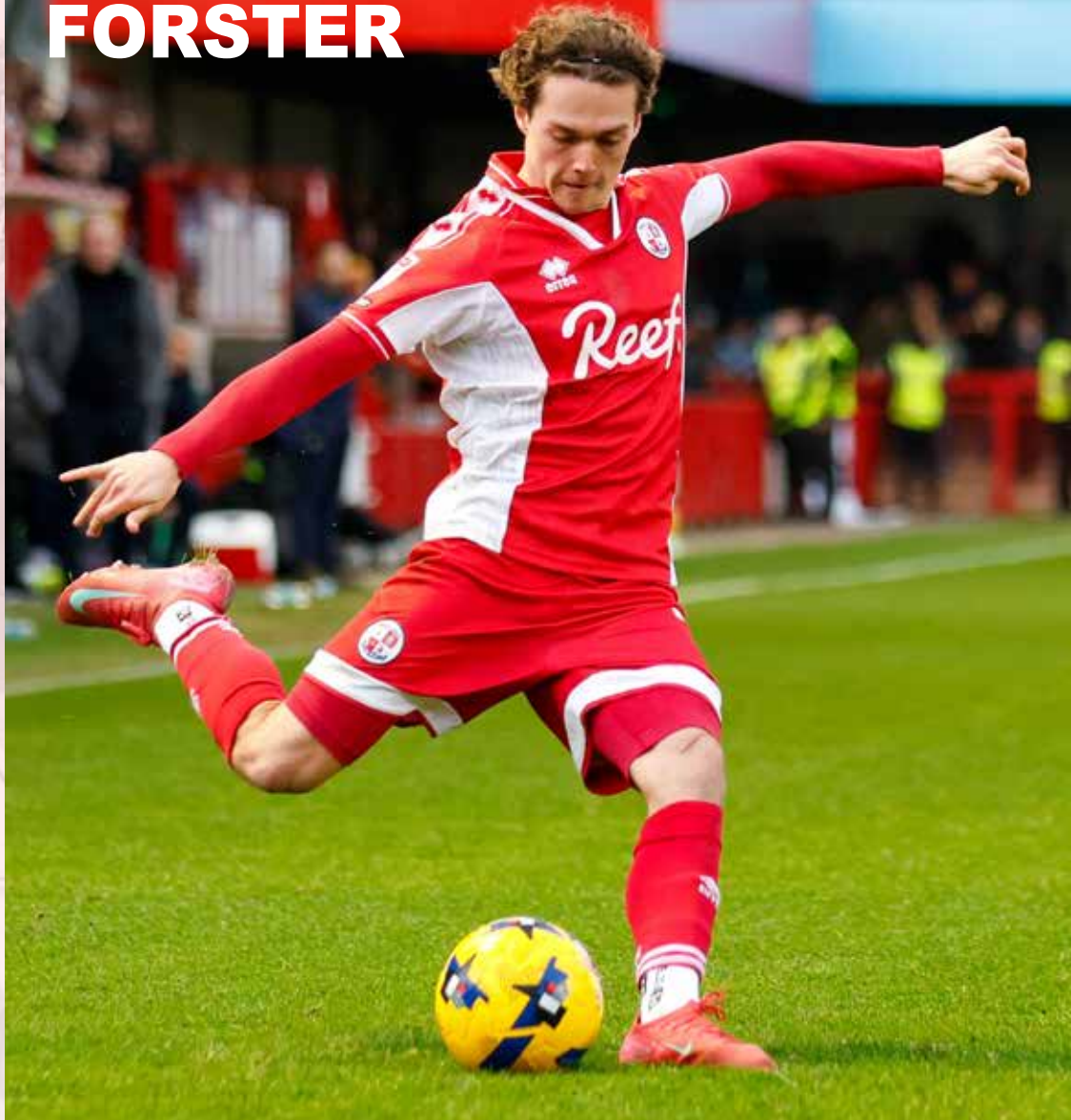

FIXTURE FEATURE - CRAWLEY VS GILLINGHAM

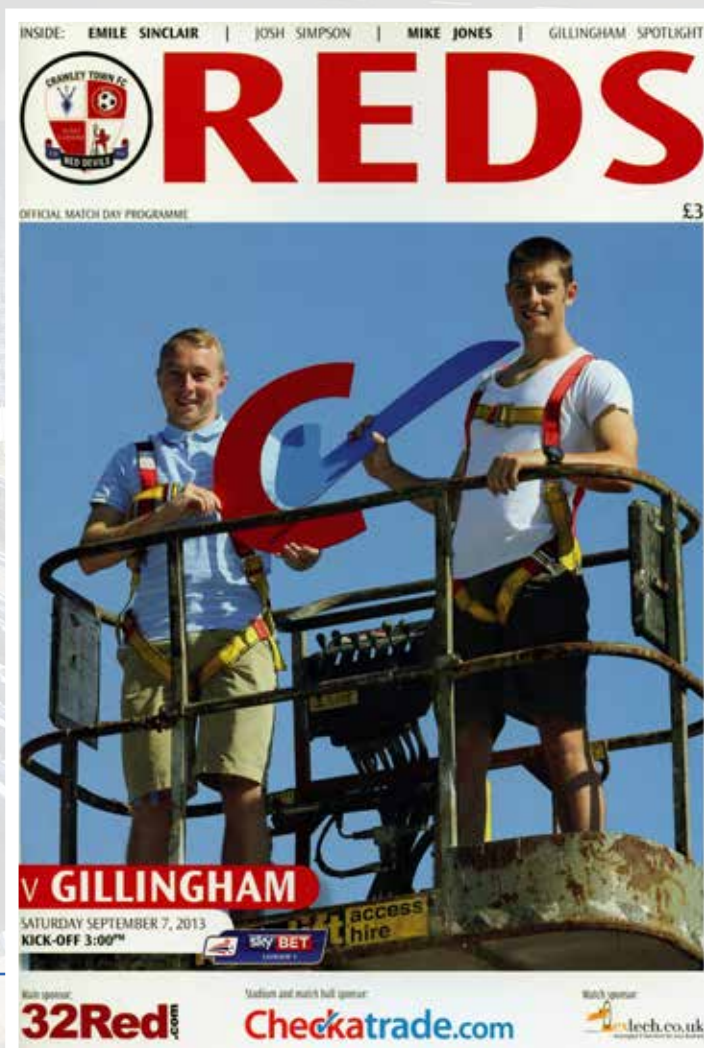
In today's feature we have the programme cover from our SkyBet League One clash on Saturday September 7th 2013, which Crawley won 3-2.

The picture shows two Crawley team members on a cherry picker with the Checktrade stadium sponsors logo. Good to see them in safety harnesses, as that unusual training session looks a bit of a health and safety nightmare.

Our defender Charlie's dad Richie Barker was in charge of the Reds at the time. The Gills were managed by Martin "mad dog" Allen. A real character (who would probably be good for Crawley right now).

Of the players listed for our opponents in this 2013 publication, it is interesting to note that No 15 Bradley Dack has been here before! (He was a mere 19 years old in 2013). Bradley had already scored his first pro goal for Charlton, in a JP Trophy game at the Broadfield in 2012, before being snapped up by Gillingham.

Meanwhile No 7 Chris Whelpdale is still going strong down at local club Burgess Hill.

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MEET THE MANAGER

GARETH AINSWORTH

Gareth Ainsworth (age 52) started out as a Youth player for his hometown club Blackburn Rovers in 1989. Between 1991 and 2020 (when he finally hung up his boots whilst playing for Woodley Utd) he made 561 appearances and scored 113 goals from midfield. When researching for this section I was surprised to find that Gareth scored a very impressive 37 goals in 83 appearances for Lincoln City between 1995 and 1997.



He won the Lincoln Player of the Year award for both the 1995–96 and 1996–97 seasons. Understandably a very popular player at Sincil Bank, Ainsworth was voted fourth in the club's top 100 legends after a poll conducted in May 2007. Gareth went on to several other clubs before establishing himself at QPR, where he completed his first century of matches at one club. Finishing with 141 (21 goals). He was there from 2003 to 2010 before moving to Wycombe Wanderers where he managed another 112 games (16 goals).

Having dipped his toe in the managerial waters whilst at QPR and Wycombe in player manager roles, he embarked on a long stint with Wycombe, where he managed to take them on several historic cup runs. (Taking on the likes of Aston Villa, Tottenham and Coventry). He also got Wycombe into the Championship for the 2020/21 season. The highest they have ever been.

In February 2023 QPR signed him as head coach, he then moved to Shrewsbury Town, before arriving at Gillingham on 25th March 2025. In September 2025 Ainsworth had to undergo routine cardiac surgery, but he is now back fit and trying to get the team firing on all cylinders again.

Fascinating trivia fact: On 21 October 2010, he represented the English Football League at the unveiling of the Footballers' Battalions memorial on the site of the Battle of the Somme.

THEY'VE PLAYED FOR BOTH SIDES

There really is nowhere else to go than straight to Crawley legend **Glenn Morris**.

Now in his 42nd year, the Woolwich born 6ft goalkeeper started out close to home, making 124 appearances between the sticks for Orient between 2001 and 2010. He then had a two year stint at Southend Utd (57 Apps) followed by another two year contract at Aldershot Town (34 apps). In 2014 he signed up with Gillingham (10 apps).

Morris was then released, so Crawley swooped in for him in May 2016 and appointed him as a player/goalkeeping coach. Before he knew it he was thrown in at the deep end and displaced the likes of Yusuf Mersin and Mitch Beeneey.

The coaching aspect was soon secondary as Glenn proceeded to make the Reds number 1 shirt his own. He was an award winning player (so many match winning/saving performances) – taking the Player of the Year Trophy in 2016/17, 2017/18 and 2018/19 and, after a short rest - to let others have a chance, he won it again in 2021/22.

He also obtained the Players Player of the Year Award and the Away Player of the Year in 2018/19. In his 6 years with Crawley he amassed a stunning 257 games! Sadly for us he was allowed out on loan to Gillingham on 29th July 2022 and moved there permanently in April 2023. If he starts today he will be sure of a warm Broadfield welcome.



ONES TO WATCH

BRADLEY DACK (age 32) is a star player who has come full circle. He started out his pro career at the Gills – playing for them from 2012 to 2017 – during which time he racked up 160 matches and 31 goals from an attacking midfield role. He was transferred to Blackburn Rovers for £750,000 in June 2017. He helped Blackburn back into the Championship and played at that high level until May 2023. Despite suffering two career threatening long term ACL knee injuries, he still managed 158 starts and 50 goals in a Rovers shirt. On release from Blackburn Bradley went to Sunderland in the 23/24 season and managed 16 appearances and 1 goal. He then returned to his original club on 15th August 2024.



SAM VOKES (age 36) is a vastly experienced Welsh International striker. He started out with top flight AFC Bournemouth (he was born in Southampton) in 2006 and made 54 starts (16 goals). After a move to Wolves in 2008 he was loaned by them to an incredible 6 clubs! Leeds Utd, Bristol City, Sheffield Utd, Norwich City, Burnley & Brighton. Burnley obviously took to him the most, as they signed him up in 2012 and he racked up 230 games and 56 goals for them. Stoke then took him on their books in 2019 (78 starts 8 goals) after he was allowed to leave Turf Moor in the January window. However after drifting into a bit of a super sub role he moved to Wycombe Wanderers on 28 July 2021. He made the acquaintance of a certain G Ainsworth whilst there and it was therefore no great surprise when he signed for Gillingham in June 2025. In a Wales career that spanned from 2008 to 2019 Sam accumulated 64 caps and 11 goals for his country.

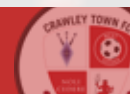

COLCHESTER UNITED 0-0 REDS FRIDAY 13TH MARCH



I've never been to Colchester before, so I went up early to have a wander around the Roman founded city, do some sightseeing, a bit of charity shop browsing, and have plenty of time to get to the ground.

Which is convenient if travelling by car, but it isn't great by public transport, especially for evening games, as there are buses out to the stadium pre-game, but they stop running before half time, so it's taxi or an hour's walk back to the train station.

Perhaps the ground should be called the Jobsworth stadium; they wouldn't let me bring my bag in, and therefore I left my glasses in the bag. Then to add insult to incompetence they let lots of others in with the same sized or larger bags. Fuming!

The game gets underway. It takes a while for anything to happen football wise. A couple of corners for us, a couple of tame shots. Colchester break and Scott Malone gets a booking for stopping it. Colchester players are

getting caught offside early on, but then they beat the offside trap next time around; passes in to our box as we fail to clear and a shot goes wide.

They're getting forward more, a shot from outside the box is straight at Jacob Chapman. And again, a cross in and a header saved. We attack and have a shot, but Colchester break and get their own. A long throw is cleared and there is a lightning break and the cross in hits Malone and forces a good save from Chapman.

The corner is taken short and we're asleep, it comes to an unmarked player and his shot is blocked, as three defenders throw themselves at it.

A strong old school challenge from Barker brings a yellow, with the home fans calling for a red. We're struggling to get out of our own half, giving free kicks away, allowing crosses, just about dealing with them.

We finally get out and get a throw, Russell heaves it in, but it's cleared. Geraldo Bajrami plays it out from midfield to Russell on the left and his cross wins a corner. The keeper

puts it out for another which comes to nothing. Taylor Richards picks up a booking for a late challenge closing a defender down.

There's one added minute but only a distant echo of the announcement from the home stand; they haven't bothered turning the speakers on in the away end. The half time whistle goes and it's all square 0-0.

It takes three minutes of the second half for us to get out of our own half. A Kellan Gordon cross is put out for a throw. Colchester win it and break. We win a free kick in midfield, and are offside when it comes in. Colchester break, get a cross in, a shot is blocked, we break and Richards runs box to box, slips it left for Klaidi Lolos, he cuts inside and his shot goes just wide right.

As an attack is cleared Russell picks up a yellow for a tackle on halfway. Chapman is not having his best kicking game, putting a lot of balls straight out on the left. A blatant (oscar winning) dive doesn't bring about the penalty the Colchester player and fans were hoping for.

Gordon wins a free kick, it's headed out and we pass it back to Chapman. Dion Pereira plays a ball to Gordon, then it's on to Richards, and his shot is blocked, back to Gordon and we get a corner. Which the ref stops twice to have words with Bajrami and the Colchester number 6, the second time after a theatrical dive from the latter claiming an elbow. When the corner comes in it is cleared.

Substitution time. Malone, Richards, and Russell are replaced by Akin Odimayo, Ronan Darcy, and Harry Forster. Down the left Pereira and Forster combine and Forster is cynically taken out. We win the free kick, but there's no card. Of course we waste the free kick. Colchester make some subs of their own and we replace Lolos with Tobi Adeyemo.

A long ball out by Colchester goes down the left and they get a cross in which Chapman fumbles behind for a corner. And so the loop begins. Five corners, all taken short, all of which we are asleep for before we finally clear it.

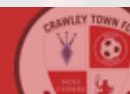
We break and waste a chance to use the overlap. A long ball sees an Adeyemo flick onto Danilo Orsi, he lays it off to Darcy and his low shot is saved for a corner and finally Barker slices an attempt high. Forster gets a booking, there are three added minutes,

We put the ball into the box four times but can't produce a shot, And Bajrami picks up our sixth booking (all deserved, but Colchester got none, yet three challenges as bad as any of ours).

The whistle goes and it's 0-0 and a point, but it wasn't a great spectacle (even without mine on).

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REDS 1-1 BARNET TUESDAY 17TH MARCH



Home action on a Tuesday night, the second evening game on the trot, and Barnet are the visitors. It is a more positive start from Crawley than we had against the same opposition on New Year's Day.

But that wouldn't have been difficult! Straight from the off Kellan Gordon is a threat down the right and pings in three early crosses. Another ball into the box sees a header come back off the post, three shots are blocked at source, (damn those Barnet defenders) finally it's cleared.

The game is a bit feisty, players are getting a lecture from the ref early on. A Barnet free kick goes across the box, and we take three attempts to clear, it comes back and goes across the six-yard box and out for a corner. We launch it clear, breaking one of the drainpipes on the east marquee in the process, luckily the monsoon season seems to be over.

Barnet get a shot which takes a deflection for a corner. It's taken short then put deep for a goal kick. The ref's lecturing again, and there's a booking for a Barnet player. Gordon gets a cross into the box, there are two smothered attempts at shots, back to Gordon, and his cross is headed over the

KRL Logistics stand for ball loss number one.

There's a corner at the other end which we clear but Barnet get yet another corner, and the ref is still on his lecturing tour. It's taken deep and a shot goes wide. Gordon is chuntering at the lino this side after some non-decisions following a couple of seemingly brutal Barnet challenges; and one of the fans trots down to the advert boards and offers the lino his glasses. A Reds free kick is pumped into the box, only for Barnet to break and get a corner at the other end. The resulting shot is wide.

They have another shot from the edge of the area which Jacob Chapman saves for a corner. We clear and put a cross in, Gordon has a shot blocked, as is the follow up, and it's cleared. There's an off the ball clash and Gordon appeared to have been elbowed. None of the officials have seen it. It's like a game of skittles out there; players are going down all over the pitch; the ref's letting a lot go, and annoying both sets of fans.

Barnet win a corner, it is taken short, and a deflected shot goes for yet another corner. It's flicked on and Chapman saves. He launches it and it's taken down by Danilo Orsi, he feeds Gordon and his cross is put out for a throw from which we win a corner, it's taken too deep and goes straight out for a goal kick. (The curse of the modern aerodynamic ball. In the olden days you were lucky if it made it to the near post.)

It's very snippy. The ref's still lecturing players at every dead ball. Jonny Russell charges down a clearance and the ball spins to Orsi but the flag is up for offside. There's one added minute during which Geraldo Bajrami picks up a booking, and the half time whistle goes with the scores level at 0-0.

Into the second half Russell plays it to Klaidi Lolos, and his shot is blocked. It comes back to Malone who plays it to Lolos in the box, but his cross is cleared. We give a disputed throw away, we switch off, and a deep cross is put in, and it's headed back across the goal and bundled in at the other post and we trail 0-1.

Down the left from the kick-off, switch it to the right to Gordon, back into the middle to Taylor Richards and he's fouled in the D. Lolos takes, the wall jumps, he puts it in under the wall, but there isn't any real power to it, and it is an easy save.

Coming out from the back and it's a war of attrition, one of our players goes down, then a Barnet winger likewise, and another of our players is taken out. There's a booking for the Barnet player. As players slowly get to their feet we make a couple of substitutions, with Lolos and Russell being replaced by Ronan Darcy and Harry Forster.

We follow this up with a whole series of getting balls into the box, it pinballs around, and NOT being able to get a decent shot, we do the same three times, before it goes out for a goal kick. We make another substitution with Malone being replaced by Akin Odimayo. There's a promising break down the right as Gordon, Barker, and Dion Pereira combine well, but there's a foul in the box. A Gordon cross is hefted over the Eden Utilities Stand for ball loss two, and a corner.

At the other end Chapman smacks a clearance at a Barnet player and it spins back and hits the post and goes out for a goal kick. Barnet then get a corner, it comes

in and Chapman snatches the ball off the line, but the lino has his flag up for offside. We make our final substitution with Pereira being replaced by Tobi Adeyemo.

A Gordon cross finds Forster on the edge of the box, but his shot doesn't have enough power to beat the keeper. A deep cross is retrieved by Forster and his cross flicks off a Barnet head for a corner. It goes into the near post and is headed half clear, Gordon steams into the box to win it and there's a coming together and he goes down.

It doesn't look like anything's going to be given, but eventually the ref blows his whistle and points to the penalty spot. Orsi takes it with power and the keeper goes the right way, but it is in! The crowd go wild. Orsi has his first goal for us since his return, and we are level 1-1.

After the goal, there's argy-bargy with getting the ball back to halfway, and Darcy and a Barnet player pick up bookings for it.

As the game restarts there are seven added minutes shown. Crawley are really dominating now.

A free kick in our half is pumped down the right, passed inside to Jay Williams, and he plays it across to Darcy who pings a superb shot which the keeper gets down well to tip round the post. It is cleared for a throw and Barker launches it into the box, but there is a free kick to Barnet.

Another ball up and there's a shot from Richards, but he slices it and it spins out for a goal kick. The ref blows the final whistle, and it finishes as yet another draw 1-1. (That now makes 5 draws in 6 games.)

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FLEETWOOD TOWN 1-0 REDS SATURDAY 21ST MARCH



Another marathon trip, but a weekend away at my mum's so that is a bonus. It was officially the first day of spring, and the sun had come out in celebration of that fact. And sat in the north stand it was in our eyes for most of the game – which, along with the haze, made watching what was on the pitch more painful than usual.

We are in the all-black third kit (never a good sign) as Fleetwood are in their home colours of red shirts, white shorts, and red socks. Into the game, and we get an early corner, it's taken deep and headed back across and met by another header which goes wide. A couple of minutes later, we win another corner, it's taken deep again, headed back and a shot is blocked. Fleetwood attack down the right and get a cross in and Geraldo Bajrami is injured putting it out for a corner and replaced by Akin Odimayo. Meanwhile Fleetwood have chances from 2 corners, Jacob Chapman saves one, and the other is wide.

We get a corner, it is taken deep, headed back in, and cleared out to Dion Pereira who cuts inside and curls a shot and a defensive header deflects it out for another corner. It hits the first man, and the ever reliable Kellan Gordon pumps it back in, but the offside flag is up. The Fleetwood right winger is getting a lot of joy down that side, and another cross comes in, there's a free header near the penalty spot, but it's close enough to Chapman for

him to save. The ref is letting a lot go on both sides. To an extent I can understand it being a bit agricultural out there, after all the pitch does remind me of a ploughed field in places. Danilo Orsi wins a free kick about twenty-five yards out to the left of the box. Taylor Richards takes it (I'm not sure if it was a cross or a shot) and the keeper claims it quite easily.

Fleetwood win a corner after Jonny Russell tries (and fails) to shepherd a ball out for a goal kick. It comes in, is nodded down and a shot goes well over the bar from three yards out, a let off. Odimayo is down after a challenge contesting for the resulting goal kick. It looks worse than it is, and the Fleetwood player gets a booking for it. We are trying to make a mess of things, passing it back to Chapman, he's taking too long and it's blocked and comes back to a Fleetwood striker, the offside flag is up before he puts the ball in the net. Fleetwood win another corner and Russell is down in a heap as he deflected the ball with his balls for the corner. It's cleared.

There are four added minutes. Klaidi Lolos switches the ball to Gordon and his cross in to the area takes a deflection and goes to the keeper. Pereira gets the ball in midfield and sets off on a mazy run, beating three players before getting a shot off, which takes a deflection for a corner, and it comes in straight to the keeper. The half time whistle goes, and it is scoreless. We really need to find a way to score, at least occasionally, from the corner kick concept!

So on Into the second half. There's an early stoppage as a Fleetwood player is down. From the drop ball restart we work it to Richards

and his shot from distance is over the bar. A long ball forward to Russell in the box sees him dispossessed. A couple of borderline tackles (one from each side) are ignored and the game calms down and falls into a midfield morass. Fleetwood come down the right again, beat a player, cut inside, play it across the front of the box and back to the middle where a crisp shot comes in... which beats Chapman and we trail 0-1. Having not been to a Fleetwood match before, what came next was both a surprise, and in retrospect, probably the only bright spot of the afternoon as they played the Captain Pugwash theme as a goal celebration.

Before the restart we make a couple of substitutions, with Lolos and Russell going off, to be replaced by Ronan Darcy and Ade Adeyemo. Only to nearly give another goal away and then another Chapman clearance is charged down, but fortunately Fleetwood take too long over having a shot, we get a block in and the ball falls nicely for Chapman to collect. We attack down the right and Gordon's cross is just behind the players in the box and goes out for a throw. It's taken to Pereira and his cross in is cleared.

Scott Malone plays a ball to Adeyemo, he gets into the box, plays it back to Darcy, but it's whipped off his toes. It comes back and Darcy plays it to Adeyemo who beats a man and his cross is deflected for a corner which is taken deep, headed back and cleared off the line. It's put back in, and we win another corner only to give away a free kick when it comes in.

Pereira and then Richards are felled in quick succession in midfield, but nothing is given. Darcy has a retaliatory foul, and the ref does give that, but in doing so rather annoys the Fleetwood players - as the advantage was on and they were in on goal in numbers. Sometimes incompetent refereeing can help us. A throw on the left goes all the way over to Gordon and his shot is blocked and cleared. It comes back to Adeyemo, and he gets past two and into the box and is then blocked for a corner. It is hit deep and cleared, put back in, intercepted and Fleetwood break; they have a three on one at the halfway line, but the one manages to force them out wide and when a cross comes in, we have people back

to challenge, and the header is claimed by Chapman.

Time for more subs; with Malone and Pereira making way for the returning Lewis Richards and Harry McKirdy. The latter is soon in action, and we get into the box and look to have a chance, but McKirdy is penalised for a foul, which is a joke as the defender was trying to relieve him of his shirt. We get a free kick about 35 yards out, dead centre, it's worked sideways to create an angle, and Charlie Barker pings it out to Adeyemo, he drifts in and crosses, it's put out for a corner which as usual comes to nothing.

There's a lot of sideways and backwards passing and suddenly from nowhere the ball ends up with Lewis Richards about forty yards out and he just lets fly. The keeper gets fingertips to it to nudge it onto the post, and out for a corner. We only just stop a break away from it on the halfway line. We get a free kick, and Darcy puts it into the box, Jay Williams gets on the end of it, but the header is straight at the keeper.

McKirdy breaks into the box and beats a couple of men before going down under a challenge. He's claiming a penalty, and the ref takes a few seconds to decide before pointing for a goal kick. As in the first half, there are four added minutes. Fleetwood play a long ball down the right, waltz into the box and have a shot which is blocked. We attack and Gordon is fouled just to the right of the penalty area, which brings a booking for Fleetwood. There is no urgency to take the thing though, and Chapman comes up for it as well, it is cleared and it takes a tackle from Adeyemo just before halfway to prevent a chance.

The full-time whistle goes and it is another defeat on the road 0-1. It's a long trek home for the 158 Crawley fans, but a large number are hitting the bright lights of Blackpool for the night first. A case of drowning sorrows rather than celebrating, sadly.

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BLACK CATS, MAGPIES AND RED DEVILS

Due to visiting my wife's family in Newcastle, I sadly had to miss Tuesday night under the lights against Barnet. I did catch the second half on TV, as we huffed and puffed without creating a huge amount, despite Kellan Gordon constantly providing crosses and eventually winning us a penalty – probably the only way we were going to score, an opinion backed up by watching our struggles at Fleetwood on Saturday.

Football-wise, the trip wasn't much better as my "other" team (from a link through my nan's family), Sunderland (the Black Cats), had just lost at home to that lot from Falmer, while Newcastle (the Magpies) were battered by Barcelona, to the dismay of all my in-laws. Can we just write off this season and pretend it never happened (while retaining our EFL status)?

Though I didn't manage to get to a game, I did fit in a trip to the Stadium of Light, home of Sunderland, to meet up with Bob Stokoe, visit

the shop for a new scarf (also red and white, to go with my collection of Crawley scarves) and then take in a tour of the Sunderland Fans Museum.

For any football fan, irrespective of your allegiance, I know it's a long way from Crawley but if you are ever in the area I recommend the Fans Museum. It's just down the road from the stadium, in the old Monkwearmouth station building, and if you are lucky (like we were) you get a guided tour from one of the volunteer staff. It consists, apparently, of one man's lifetime collection, largely Sunderland-related, but with items from other clubs as well (even Newcastle and Middlesbrough) and includes some of his collection of 4,500 football shirts, as well as all manner of other football ephemera.

As an example, we saw the aforementioned Bob Stokoe's outfit, worn when guiding Sunderland to the FA Cup win in 1973, as well as a wall of Cup Final programmes, photos, a shirt worn by Pelé and even Paolo Di Canio's suit from when he did the famous slide on the pitch in 2013, when Sunderland scored a second goal in the derby against Newcastle (still with its mud and grass stains!).

There were no definite links with Crawley that I could see, but a few tenuous ones (aside from Di Canio himself, who managed Swindon against us in the 2011/12 season) such as a Fabio Borini shirt from his Sunderland days, with Borini doing us a favour last week by scoring two against our relegation rivals Barrow, for his latest club Salford. One or two other exhibits also stirred a memory or two of our days at Town Mead, including an old cast iron turnstile and the dressing room treatment table from Sunderland's old home of Roker Park.

I remember the early 1970s, when a group of us fans were helping to install our new turnstiles in the newly erected entrance block at Town Meadow. I say "new", but the turnstiles were purchased second-hand (or third or fourth) and in a fairly sorry state, although they saw sterling service with us for over 20 years.

I have included a photo of the turnstile block at Town Meadow, a while after installation, to hopefully jog a few memories. The fire station tower in the distance gives an idea of the ground location for younger fans.

Mention of the Roker Park treatment table also reminded me of a picture in my collection loaned by the Bastable family of our very similar treatment table at Town Meadow, with Fred Cunnell ministering (?) to the aches and pains of one of our star players of the

1950s, Doug Bastable. It's nice to see that Football League stars of the time were not totally divorced from the everyman facilities our players had to accept in the Metropolitan League days.

Also in the fan museum were many pairs of football boots, including those primitive leather items with leather studs nailed to the bottom of the soles.

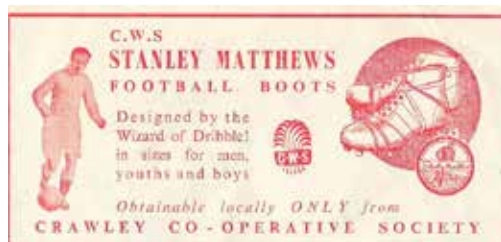
Some of these were advertised in Crawley programmes (pictured) of the 1950s and early 1960s under the Stanley Matthews brand name. I still can't quite see how Matthews (the "Wizard of the Dribble") was able to perform all that deft trickery with the ball, while wearing something more suited to working down a coal mine!

Another day, another football memory, as the following day we visited a second-hand bookshop (Kev Neylon isn't the only one to root around for old footy stuff in obscure towns around England!) in Whitley Bay, where I just happened to see a copy of the Weekly Chronicle from May 1952. It was a special edition celebrating Newcastle United's recent FA Cup 1-0 win against (Lucky) Arsenal at Wembley, with the only goal scored by George Robledo (commemorated on a John Lennon album cover for his Walls and Bridges LP) from Chile, whose daughter Elizabeth we are still in touch with.

Not that much of a link with us, maybe, but I saw in the paper (I snapped up this bargain for a tanner!) several photos featuring another Newcastle star of the time, Jackie Milburn, and I remembered that after his retirement, when he had moved into journalism, Jackie took part in a charity match at Town Meadow in October 1961. The match was Jimmy Hill's International XI versus the TV Entertainers XI and I have included the team sheet showing some of the famous names from the time who played in the game. Jackie Milburn scored four goals and Tommy Docherty two, but they were eclipsed by Welsh International Trevor Ford who scored five goals for the Entertainers XI in a match which finished 11-6 to the International XI.

Apologies for this off-piste ramble through the North East, but I aim to get back on track for my next article when we come to the exciting conclusion of the Montgomery Cup campaign
